Frank William Cullen, P.Eng., New Glasgow, 80, passed away at Aberdeen Hospital, New Glasgow, N.S., Wednesday, January 11, 2017. His successful career took him to many places worldwide, working for many years in Chicago, Ill., shorter periods in a variety of places including Africa and Europe, as well as working at Trenton Works.
