Born in 1912, entered into Eternal Rest at the Moncton City Hospital On February 8th, 2007.

The Grand Chapter of New Brunswick was saddened on the passing of Brother Fred Woodworth at the Moncton City Hospital on February 8th, 2007. At the time of his passing, Brother Fred was 94. Born in Stewiacke, Brother Fred was the son of the late Frederick and Edith (Webster) Woodworth.

He was a veteran of the Second World War, serving with the Dental Corps of the Canadian Army, in charge of the Orderly Room. Brother Fred was employed with Corrections Canada for 25 years. He was a member of the Sackville Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion. Brother Fred also attended St. John's United Church in Moncton, NB.

Brother Fred was a Past Master of Sussex Lodge #4 F & AM. He joined the Order of the Eastern Star in December of 1964 when he became a member of Harmony #29, Dorchester, NB. Brother Fred served as Worthy Patron on several occasions. He was Grand Representative of Ontario in 1973. He served the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick as Worthy Grand Patron in 1982-1983, and shared the East with his Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Jean Scott. In September of 1995, Brother Fred affiliated with Fort Monckton Chapter #11, Port Elgin.

Predeceased by his first wife, Sister Bessie (Raworth) and his second wife, Sister Georgie Allam, Brother Fred is survived by his 2 sons, Alan (Betty) of Lower Coverdale; and Donald (Therese) of Moncton; 2 daughters, Joan LeBlanc of Moncton and Carolyn (Darryl) Steeves of Halifax, NS; 9 grandchildren; 4 great-grandchildren, and a sister, Sister Eva Steele of Amherst, NS.

An Eastern Star Service was conducted by the members of Fort Monckton #11 of Port Elgin at the Ferguson Knowles Funeral Home on February 9th, 2007. Funeral Services were held from Ferguson Knowles Funeral Home on Saturday, February 10th, 2007 at 2:00 PM with Rev. Aaron Billard officiating. Burial took place in the Pine Grove Cemetery, Stewiacke, NS in the spring.
